CHAD MOORE VICTOR FIGUEROA ALYCE DECKLER WILLIAMS HAIYMANOT WOLDESELASSE --- ---	1 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: -- and seconded. 2 Is there any discussion on the minutes? 3 (no response) 4 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Seeing or hearing none, 5 all in favor of approval of the minutes of 6 the April 25th Finance Committee Meeting signify 7 by saying, "Aye." 8 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Aye. 9 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Aye. 10 COMMISSIONER REYES: Aye. 11 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: Aye. 12 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Opposed likewise? 13 (no response) 14 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: By your action, you have 15 approved the minutes. 16 I have no Chair's Comments at this time. 17 At this time, I am going to turn it over to 18 our CFO for the Agency Financial Overview. 19 At this time, I will turn it over to Ms. Davis. 20 Ms. Davis, the floor is now yours. 21 MS. DAVIS: Thank you very much. 22 Good morning. 23 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Good morning. 24 MS. DAVIS: I have provided for you budget 25 comparisons in chart and graph forms for April,

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1 2025. In addition, the graphs contain the prior 2 year, Fiscal Year 2024, actuals, also. 3 Generally, for COCC, the year-to-date 4 expenses of about \$383,000 exceed budget due to 5 the timing of the accounts payable mainly. 6 Public Housing year-to-date actuals are 7 slightly lower than the prior year activity. 8 Housing Choice Voucher revenue and expenses 9 align with the budget in the prior year. 10 The RAD properties are operating in alignment 11 with budget for our fiscal year to date. 12 At the last meeting, I believe the 13 Board Chair asked about the variance of the 14 Franklin Arms. She wanted to know why there was 15 such a great variance between actual and budget, 16 and we've done that research. 17 And the difference is a big difference. 18 Revenues are less than budgeted, but a bigger 19 difference is taxes. We have paid property taxes 20 of over \$105,000, and none was budgeted. 21 The property is owned by JHA Franklin Arms, 22 LLC. This entity is not a tax-exempt 23 organization, and, based on that, we are still on 24 the tax roll. 25 And I'm not sure if it's that way because,	1 trying to securitize this with Freddie Mac as a 2 partner. 3 So they're having to trade out CRBT for 4 another bank. Again, all of those details are 5 forthcoming, and I just wanted to just give you 6 some warning that it was coming. And, if the 7 board has to make an approval, it will be at the 8 next meeting. 9 Accounts payable -- we are progressing with 10 that. Generally, we are paying the payables on 11 time. It comes out every now and then that 12 there's one that we didn't know about for some 13 reason, and we pay those as soon as possible. 14 But we don't have a list of payables that are 15 unpaid. We are working that and paying those on 16 time. 17 And I believe it was mentioned in the 18 HR meeting that an announcement had gone out for 19 the CFR, and I'd like to just remind this group 20 that I was brought in here on an interim basis. 21 And so that natural term is about to end. 22 And the date is a tentative date of July 18th, 23 2025, but it could be as early as June 30th, 24 2025. But I just wanted to just put you on notice 25 that we know that that interim assignment is
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1 in order to take advantage of low-income tax 2 credits, you have to be on the roll to do that or 3 not, but that's the main reason the expenses are 4 so high is because we are still paying taxes on 5 this property. 6 MS. CORBETT: And 40 units. 7 MS. DAVIS: I'm sorry? 8 MS. CORBETT: And an occupancy of just 9 40 units. 10 MS. DAVIS: Right. We did not budget for 11 that at all. 12 Okay. So, in addition to comparing the 13 budget with actuals, one matter we're working on 14 now is CRBT, Cedar Rapids Bank & Trust, 15 and they hold the mortgage on The Waves. 16 They are securitizing that mortgage, 17 and so work is being done in that. And they are 18 -- a lot of parties are involved, and there is a 19 possibility that something will need to come 20 before the board next month to approve what 21 they're doing. It should not have any substantive 22 effect on the mortgage holder, which is The Waves. 23 The rates, the time of the payment and the 24 overall debt should not change, but CRBT is not a 25 party that Freddie Mac deals with. And they're	1 coming to end in the near future. 2 Also, we have an ongoing audit with 3 Berman Hopkins, and we have online Laura Pray, 4 who is the managing partner of that audit, 5 to give us an overview of that. And I believe 6 that is the next item on the agenda. 7 MS. PRAY: Hello. 8 Can you guys hear me? 9 COMMISSIONER REYES: Yes. 10 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Yes. 11 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: I can. 12 But, before we go to the audit, let me make 13 sure if any commissioners have any questions as it 14 relates to the financial overview at this time. 15 Are there any questions? 16 COMMISSIONER REYES: Yes. 17 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Reyes. 18 COMMISSIONER REYES: I have just two, 19 through the Chair to Ms. Davis. 20 I know that we talked about having the vendor 21 meetings just to kind of, you know, fix and 22 reconcile some of the relationship issues we've 23 had as a result of some of the payables. 24 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Reyes, 25 if you can, turn your mike on.

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1 COMMISSIONER REYES: Oh, I am so sorry. 2 I apologize. Thank you. 3 Through the Chair to Ms. Davis, one of the 4 questions is regarding the vendors' meeting. 5 So, did we end up having it? 6 I know we talked about it in the last 7 meeting. 8 MS. DAVIS: Yes. 9 COMMISSIONER REYES: What was the status of 10 that? 11 MS. DAVIS: Yes, we did. I would like to say 12 that we have had a meeting. Mr. Weathers, 13 in procurement -- it was an overall vendors' 14 meeting, an outstanding meeting that was presented 15 for them. 16 And, on that meeting, I had an opportunity to 17 address the attendees, and I believe there were 18 over 50 that attended on the payables themselves 19 and the problem and announced that we would meet 20 with them with a payables forum. 21 And the first one is May 21st from 22 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. in this room, and it's -- 23 we are RSVPing the first 20 who are interested in 24 attending. We made the announcement then, 25 and all vendors that accounts payable are talking	1 MS. CORBETT: -- in regards to that who we've 2 got in, and we're going to also have BEO as a part 3 of that interview process to fully vet our new CFO 4 for the future. 5 COMMISSIONER REYES: Wonderful. Thank you. 6 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: At this time, Commissioner 7 Shirley. 8 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: Thank you so much, 9 through the Chair. 10 Being a person who looks at numbers all day, 11 I appreciate your dashboards. I did not get this 12 digitally. 13 Is it possible that we can get a copy of the 14 comparison as a digital copy? 15 MS. DAVIS: Yes. Most definitely. 16 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: Thank you. 17 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Brock. 18 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Yes. Mr. Chair to 19 Ms. Davis. 20 Ms. Davis, is the commissioners going to be 21 invited to that vendors' meeting, or we're not? 22 MS. DAVIS: Yes -- the first 20 people. 23 Yes. 24 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: We just have to be 25 certain that, if we are going to have
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1 to who want to come in -- we're inviting them to 2 come in that date. 3 COMMISSIONER REYES: Great. So it's been 4 received well? 5 MS. DAVIS: Very well. 6 COMMISSIONER REYES: Good. And then I guess 7 my second question, through the Chair to the CEO, 8 and, in the interest of ... I'm not going to get 9 into an operations conversation. I'm just 10 curious. 11 Have we received any applicants for the CFO 12 position? 13 MS. CORBETT: So it's actually set as a 14 national search right now for the CFO. 15 In addition to that, we're going to have a 16 private sector vendor that's going to be here 17 within the month of June, which will be 18 BEO National. So they're the financial 19 consultants that train HUD and other public 20 housing authorities just to make sure that we 21 don't miss a beat, but it's actively out there, 22 too, as well. 23 So I'll have an update -- 24 MS. DAVIS: I can actually update you next 25 week.	1 commissioners ... through the Chair, I'm sorry -- 2 that we public notice it if there's going to be 3 more than one commissioner present. 4 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Brock, 5 did you have a follow-up? 6 COMMISSIONER BROCK: No. Ms. Phillips just 7 -- thank you, Mr. Chair. Ms. Phillips just 8 answered it, because I was going to say that, 9 if we were coming, we needed to do a public 10 notice. 11 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Okay. Commissioner Reyes. 12 COMMISSIONER REYES: And, to Commissioner 13 Brock's point, we did address that, 14 inviting like a board member, at least the Chair 15 of the board or the Finance Chair, to just show 16 like, you know, an intention of reconciling and 17 kind of mending those relationships that have been 18 a little rocky. 19 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Okay. Can I say 20 -- 21 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Yes, Commissioner Horovitz. 22 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: -- and I'm sorry. 23 I apologize through the Chair. I don't remember 24 that conversation. If I'm supposed to be there, 25 please invite me whoever. I don't remember

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1 what we decided. 2 COMMISSIONER REYES: Right. We didn't define 3 what it was -- 4 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Right. 5 COMMISSIONER REYES: -- but it was the idea 6 of like either showing up -- 7 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yes. Absolutely. 8 Yes. Perfect. 9 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Are there any other 10 questions? 11 (no response) 12 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: I have one quick question. 13 I'm not sure if you can answer this question 14 today. 15 But, recognizing that, "in the news," 16 if you will, the Housing Choice Vouchers are, 17 "on the chopping block," if you will, 18 how would that impact our agency? 19 Or, with that discussion happening, 20 how do we proceed going forward? 21 MS. CORBETT: Yes. And that budget is back 22 out, again, too, as well, for further discussion, 23 because, originally, it was set in D.C. for 24 about \$33,000,000,000 to be potentially slashed 25 overall as it relates to the housing pool HUD	1 with the VA, too, as well, because this is an 2 opportunity at least, at best, to have an RFP out 3 and get people housed on the Veterans' side of 4 it. 5 So we still have some flexibility within the 6 Section 8 Program within certain specific 7 demographics right now. So, yes. 8 In the future, we're hoping to request for 9 more funds, and we'll kind of see what's going to 10 happen in D.C. right about now. But, as of today, 11 we know it's not hopefully going to be that 12 \$33,000,000,000. So really more to follow. 13 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Sounds good. Thank you. 14 My last question -- I swear sometimes I sound 15 like a preacher, because I say, "my last 16 question," or, "my last point." 17 COMMISSIONER REYES: "My last word ..." 18 (People laughed.) 19 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: When I joined this board 20 two years ago, one of the things that was provided 21 to us was the number of the programs that we had, 22 and then it gave us the utilization or the 23 percentage. 24 And thank you for mentioning VASH. 25 VASH was one of our lowest. I think it was at
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1 funds, especially, in particular, 2 the Housing Choice Voucher Program. 3 I think right now we're at a utilization rate 4 of about 92 percent, right, and so that's within 5 our primary portfolio of the HCV Program. 6 What's interesting is that, you know, 7 it's -- the likelihood of getting to 100 percent 8 is very slim only because, when we look at our 9 rental rates here locally in Jacksonville, 10 on average, we're shelling out about approximately 11 \$980 -- \$960 to \$980 on average when we're only 12 receiving in about approximately \$680 to \$690. 13 And so, as you can see, there is a delta 14 of \$300 that we're overly exhausting. So right 15 about now we continue to see that that trend will 16 be probably at like 92 percent. We should be fine 17 in regards to what we have currently. 18 I think right now, when we look at our 19 voucher program, we have opportunities in VASH, 20 but the utilization isn't necessarily as high. 21 And so our team is going to be working internally 22 to put out an RFP, and I think we have a little 23 bit over 20-plus VASH vouchers readily available. 24 The team is actively working on that. 25 So we're going to be working in conjunction	1 27 percent, if I recall. I'm not sure what 2 percentage it is at now, but it was one of the 3 lowest as far as how we was getting done. 4 We had a whole conversation, if you-all 5 recall -- those who were here -- about how we 6 worked with partners and the city to get that 7 number up, and the VA said it was on Jacksonville 8 Housing's side. Jacksonville Housing said it was 9 on the VA's side. So we had a whole lengthy 10 discussion. 11 And so I'm curious, as it relates to our 12 other programs, especially -- and Commissioner 13 Reyes, I recall this conversation with you and 14 I at that time -- with our foster care or those 15 who are aging out of the foster care system. 16 Where are we at that with that program, 17 and how are we doing with that, to ensure that 18 those who are aging out ... 19 I think it was a voucher program. 20 COMMISSIONER REYES: Uh-huh. 21 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Where are we at with that? 22 MS. CORBETT: Yes. So thank you. 23 That's a great question. 24 So, when we think about our foster care 25 program, there's two under there. There's a FUP,

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Page 17 1 Family Unification Program, and the second one is 2 FYI, Fostering Youth Independence. 3 Right? 4 Fostering Youth Independence is really 5 that, you know -- really at age 16 those local 6 caseworkers would actually know if kids are most 7 likely to go home, right, by the age of 18. 8 We just had a great senior leadership meeting 9 on -- was it is Tuesday? -- 10 MS. BROWN: Yes. 11 MS. CORBETT: -- okay. Great. And there the 12 team is most definitely charged in regards to 13 writing reports for utilization. 14 Also, we look at our traditional public 15 housing portfolio, too, as well, occupancy versus 16 vacancy rates, too. So, for those two specific 17 programs, what we're going to be doing is working 18 with -- excuse me. We go by -- "Department of 19 Children and Family Services," basically to 20 partner with them in an effort to have like a 21 satellite location. 22 Some of the things I've noticed historically 23 at other housing authorities is that, you know, 24 we actually have to be the ones here at JHA 25 to kind of train and inform more those social	Page 19 1 "Can they, too, become a part of this 2 referral process?" 3 And, on average, you can normally, 4 through the FYI Program, get up to 25 referrals. 5 Once you maximize that, then you can put in 6 another special request for additional referrals, 7 too. 8 And so we're going to be working to have 9 those numbers up, but the next meeting we're going 10 to have we're going to have those reports for you, 11 too, as well. 12 Like I said, the utilization rates, 13 as it relates to the HCV Program, Section 8, 14 and then also as it relates to our traditional 15 public housing occupancy versus vacancy. 16 So you-all can be most definitely more informed. 17 And I want to also give you an update in 18 regards to those potential partnerships, too, 19 as well. So that's going to be with the VA 20 Office, and, also, like I said, as we work towards 21 serving the FUP, the Family Unification Program, 22 and then also the FYI Program. So that's 23 something, too. 24 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Love it (gave a 25 thumbs-up).
Page 18 1 workers. 2 At a local level, they don't really 3 necessarily fully understand our programming; 4 although, we're receiving referrals in. 5 So our goal right now is to really work in a 6 way to kind of get a free satellite location 7 so that it can be one-stop shop educating their 8 local staff. 9 And, also, when those participants are coming 10 in, they're going to know more about our program 11 that we have here. 12 But keep in mind the FUP and the FYI Program 13 is really referral-based, right? 14 They give us the referrals over. 15 We work with them and work towards getting them 16 housed. 17 Another thing that I've noticed, 18 especially in the FYI Program, is that, 19 when we think of housing, they have to pretty much 20 be aging out of foster care in Jacksonville. 21 So we're going to be engaging those 22 conversations, and say, "Hey, look. Outside of 23 Jacksonville, there are people in the State of 24 Florida, you know, that are aging out of foster 25 care.	Page 20 1 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Perfect. 2 Commissioner Reyes and then Commissioner 3 Horovitz. 4 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I just said, 5 "Love it," and I gave a thumbs-up. 6 (People laughed.) 7 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Reyes. 8 COMMISSIONER REYES: So thank you so much, 9 Commissioner Rogers, for bringing that up, 10 because I wasn't sure if it was in this space or 11 what space. 12 But I remember, when I did the tour with 13 the Acting CEO, we had requested two things, 14 and one of them was the program -- like a program 15 listing the occupancy that we were using. 16 And, at that time, I think we had seven 17 programs. We had VASH, FYI, FUP, had VASH, 18 Mainstream Voucher, Emergency Housing Vouchers, 19 SROs and a homeownership program I think were 20 the programs that were listed. 21 We had requested a rundown of where we were 22 in those programs and the occupancy percent. 23 So we'd like that I guess for this. 24 And then, separately, I had also specifically 25 requested some sort of a chart or physical format

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1 for us to see all the different properties, 2 because I went to like see properties in one day. 3 And it was amazing, but just to keep track of 4 like what kind of, you know, property it is, 5 you know, if it's a single-family home, 6 the amount of units, like whatever the parameters 7 were. And we can talk about that more 8 specifically. 9 MS. CORBETT: Yes. 10 COMMISSIONER REYES: I think they did provide 11 it at some point, and then they never continued 12 doing it. So there's a chart out there somewhere. 13 MS. CORBETT: So we'll be able to provide 14 it, but, when we think about those scattered 15 sites, specifically for our HCV participants or, 16 well, traditional public housing -- but of our HCV 17 participants -- the thing about that is that we 18 don't necessarily list addresses and things 19 of that nature for their safety and protection. 20 But we can most -- I will have that prepared, 21 at least a preliminary, so you can take a look at 22 that too, as well. 23 COMMISSIONER REYES: Yes. 24 MS. CORBETT: And then, collectly, 25 we can fine-tune whatever you're thinking that you	1 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: Why not? 2 We'll combine the two. 3 MS. CORBETT: And we can make it right 4 after. So that would be a good idea. 5 COMMISSIONER REYES: And, to Commissioner 6 Shirley's point, we did have this conversation, 7 because I believe, even with Ms. Roslyn, 8 we had the conversation about putting that under 9 the assets. So I did ask for this at some point 10 in this year. 11 MS. CORBETT: Okay. 12 COMMISSIONER REYES: And we did talk about 13 putting it under the Asset Management Committee. 14 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: So we get that for 15 the next Governance Committee Meeting? 16 MS. CORBETT: We can do that, and I can 17 still give an update in between. 18 And I think it's important to also capture 19 any space that we have identified as, 20 "office space," so we can most definitely hone 21 in on the vacancy percentage of the plans for the 22 future, too, as well. So I got it. I understand. 23 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Just as a follow-up, 24 is the next governance meeting scheduled? 25 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Yes.
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1 would need as a board to be more informed. 2 So not a problem. 3 COMMISSIONER REYES: Thank you. 4 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: And I know Commissioner 5 Shirley is one of our newest commissioners, 6 and so she might not have had the opportunity to 7 get all that information. So it would be good for 8 her to receive that information and see the 9 different programs and the occupancy in those 10 programs, as well, that we were provided with. 11 MS. CORBETT: We will provide that. 12 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: I was going to say, 13 if you wanted to have -- I know we had an 14 Asset Management Subcommittee at one point in 15 time, as well. I'm more than happy to share 16 my Governance Committee time with asset 17 management, because it kind of falls hand in hand. 18 MS. CORBETT: Okay. 19 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: We have to oversee 20 the physical as well as the policy side. 21 So I'm willing to share that in my committee, 22 because I think we have to have that to both 23 govern some of the things in governance, as well. 24 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Why don't just go 25 ahead and chair that committee?	1 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: It's after Resident 2 Relations. 3 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Is that next week? 4 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: The 20th (sic), yes. 5 Next Friday. 6 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you. 7 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Brock, 8 did you have a follow-up or question? 9 COMMISSIONER BROCK: No -- well, I did, 10 Mr. Chair. I just wanted to give you thumbs-up, 11 because I was going to ask the same thing about 12 the Foster Care Vouchers. And I wanted to give 13 you a thumbs-up on that. 14 And then, yes, to our Chair, 15 to Commissioner Horovitz, yes. Governance is 16 nine o'clock next Friday. 17 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you. 18 And we were just sidebarring on scheduling here. 19 It's not on my calendar from the JHA. I'm adding 20 it now so I have it. 21 I don't have a conflict, but, if we could 22 have a series of calendars sent out so I don't -- 23 because I'm missing things. 24 COMMISSIONER REYES: Yes. Me, too. 25 MS. CORBETT: So, will you take care of that

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1 today. 2 MS. BROWN: Yes. 3 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you. 4 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: All right. Are there any 5 other questions or comments for the financial 6 overview? 7 And thank you for allowing us to hear just a 8 little bit. It wasn't in there. So thank you for 9 allowing us to do it. 10 (People laughed.) 11 MS. CORBETT: No. This is good. This is 12 good. 13 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: So, at this time, 14 we'll now go into the 2024 Audit Update at this 15 time. 16 And thank you to our presenter for allowing 17 us the opportunity to get that out of the way. 18 So I'll turn it now over to you. 19 MS. PRAY: Yes. Of course. Thank you guys 20 for having me. 21 Ms. Davis asked me to do a 3-minute update. 22 So I will try to be brief but as informative as 23 possible. I know you guys have been in meetings 24 most of the morning. 25 My name is Laura Anne Pray. I'm a partner	1 and how that was recognized in the financial 2 statements. 3 We do have all of that information as of 4 now. So we're already looking better. 5 We're still in the process of testing it. 6 So we don't have all of the answers to know, 7 you know, is everything cleared? 8 And we don't have any, you know, 9 other questions, but we do have the information. 10 I know that the team has gone through that, 11 as well as consultants that the team is using. 12 So they feel comfortable with those numbers. 13 The other area that we had was there was a 14 new standard last year that was implemented. 15 It's related to how you account for your software 16 and various subscription agreements that you might 17 have. 18 The team, at the time, just really wasn't 19 able to get the information and do that 20 implementation and get that updated as needed. 21 So we do have all of that information this 22 year. You know, we are, you know, still working 23 through it and evaluating it. But that shouldn't 24 be an issue, because we have the support. 25 And now it's just, you know, getting the
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1 with Berman Hopkins. I was actually on-site 2 earlier this month or end of last month for your 3 board meeting. So I did get to meet some of you 4 then. 5 So a very quick update on the audit process. 6 There is two pieces to the audit that we do. 7 There is the financial aspect and then the 8 compliance aspect, testing of the programs and the 9 awards and the utilization of those funds. 10 You-all may remember last year's audit 11 report. We had to issue what's referred to as, 12 "a qualified opinion," and, basically, 13 that says that, for a variety of reasons, 14 we were not able to get comfortable with some 15 of the numbers that were in the financial 16 statements. 17 So that's, you know, not what you're wanting 18 as an organization. Obviously, we're all trying 19 to move forward from that. So I thought I 20 would start there. 21 There were really three or four key areas 22 that we struggled with last year. First being 23 grant revenues specifically around your 24 Capital Fund Program and being able to reconcile 25 what was received and what should have been earned	1 adjustments that are needed for the financial 2 statements. 3 And then the last area that we had was really 4 the cash balances. There were not, you know, 5 sufficient reconciliations done, proper timely 6 reconciliations done for cash, and that's just so 7 impactful to an organization, that, you know, 8 we weren't able to get comfortable with those 9 numbers. 10 As of right now, you know, we're still 11 working through it. We received most of the cash 12 information. You know, we're still working 13 through. We still have some differences that 14 we're going back and forth with the team on, 15 but I think, you know, overall we're in a better 16 position than we were last year and, you know, 17 should be able to figure those issues for the 18 audit this year. 19 There is a lot of other financial type of 20 information that we asked for support for. 21 I won't go through all of it, but I would say, 22 just at a very high-level, we have accepted 23 what the staff has provided to us. 24 We reviewed it. We tested about a third of 25 that information. We have received and are in the

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1 process of still testing about a third of that 2 information, and then there is about a third of 3 that information that is still outstanding in some 4 manner. 5 Meaning, you know, we are in the progress of 6 going back and forth with the staff on what we 7 need or getting all of the support. So, you know, 8 we're well through the audit process, which is an 9 improvement from where we've been at this point in 10 previous years. 11 You know, we are eight months past year-end. 12 I know everyone would like this process to be 13 sped up, and we've talked about, you know, 14 how we accomplish that in the future. 15 But I think, you know, when you have some of 16 the struggles that you've had as an organization, 17 it just takes a little bit of time to get back on 18 the right path and the right timeline. 19 So then that's the financial side. 20 On the compliance side, we have, you know, 21 quite a few major programs this year that we're 22 testing. So a lot of testing is being done. 23 We do disbursement testing. So that's just 24 regular expenses across all categories that are 25 going out, procurement testing, payroll testing,	1 So that was my maybe 3-minute -- 2 maybe 5-minute update. So I'm happy to answer any 3 questions that you-all may have. 4 MS. CORBETT: I promise we did not give her a 5 time. 6 (People laughed.) 7 MS. CORBETT: He did. 8 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Are there any questions 9 from the commissioners at this time? 10 (no response) 11 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you. 12 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: You did good. 13 There are no questions. 14 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yes. Excellent. 15 Thank you for the recap. 16 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Good job. Thank you so 17 much. 18 MS. PRAY: Thank you guys. 19 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: All right. At this time, 20 we will move ... unless there is any other things 21 for our, Old Business, we'll move into our 22 New Business at this time. 23 Commissioner Reyes, you had a comment? 24 COMMISSIONER REYES: Just because I'm a 25 deadline-driven person, is there an expected
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1 tenant file testing, waiting list testing. 2 You know, we do a lot of different types of 3 testing as part of our compliance. 4 And we have completed our disbursement test 5 and our payroll test. We're through all of that. 6 We don't have any issues that we came across as a 7 result of that testing. 8 We are still very much in the thick of things 9 in our tenant file testing and our, you know, 10 waiting list testing. 11 So, generally, what happens is we get the 12 files. We go through them. We have questions or 13 documents that we can't find -- maybe because of 14 lack of familiarity on our part, or sometimes 15 there is permanent filed documents that are in a 16 different location that need to be provided to 17 us. 18 So, you know, we've gone through the 19 information. We've sent our tests back -- 20 or our questions back to the team. And they are 21 working on those but still very much, you know, 22 in the, you know, weeds with that testing right 23 now to be able to tell. I'm not at a point where 24 I can tell you guys, you know, the results of that 25 testing just yet.	1 time frame for completion on this for the audit? 2 MS. CORBETT: So let's get a brief update 3 in regards to the audit completion. So the goal 4 was to make sure that we have a draft over ... 5 Laura, what was the date for the draft? 6 Because I know that we were trending 7 the percentage. We were looking at it from a 8 compliance standpoint. We just had a conversation 9 about this. 10 MS. PRAY: Yes. 11 MS. CORBETT: Yes. 12 MS. PRAY: So the hard deadline is 13 June 30th. So that is the hard deadline. 14 It's due to HUD, and it's due to the, you know, 15 Federal Clearing House. 16 In our conversations, we were really hoping 17 to have a draft by the end of this month. 18 That will be tight. That will be tough, 19 but we're still, you know, working towards that. 20 Again, improvements than the prior year. 21 MS. CORBETT: So, as soon as we receive the 22 draft from our auditors, right, what we're going 23 to do is quickly circulate it individually to 24 everyone that's on the board, right? 25 The key thing for that is that we want to

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1 identify if there is any type of material weakness 2 in regards to the findings so that you can most 3 definitely be aware of that and still invite the 4 team, the audit team, back out for, of course, 5 our June meeting. 6 Regardless of June 30th, unfortunately, 7 we're still going to have to submit on time. 8 You know? 9 And, in most cases, you want to most 10 definitely get board acceptance of it, but, 11 just please note that it will still have to go in 12 -- and, in most cases, approval sometimes happens 13 after the fact. But it's just a requirement for 14 the clearing house and so forth and per HUD's 15 regulatory compliance. 16 So we're going to get a draft out to you. 17 We're working around the clock right now. 18 So, yes. 19 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Reyes. 20 COMMISSIONER REYES: Sorry. So June 30th? 21 Is that -- 22 MS. CORBETT: That is the submitted deadline. 23 COMMISSIONER REYES: Okay. But that's also 24 -- are we also scheduled to have a board meeting 25 -- it's the last Monday of the month.	1 talk through those logistics, too, before we 2 even get to the point of submitting it, too. 3 So, ideally, we would hope to have it two 4 months in advance of the submittal going forward. 5 So, yes. 6 COMMISSIONER REYES: So, just to close my 7 loop -- so we'll get an email draft -- the draft 8 emailed to us directly, and we'll be able to ask 9 questions? 10 MS. CORBETT: Absolutely. 11 COMMISSIONER REYES: And then we will be 12 presented with like whatever at that point we have 13 as a final draft -- 14 MS. CORBETT: Yes -- 15 COMMISSIONER REYES: -- at the June meeting. 16 MS. CORBETT: -- correct. 17 COMMISSIONER REYES: Are we having a June 18 board meeting? 19 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yes. 20 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: Yes, yes. 21 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Yes. 22 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you for sending 23 all that. 24 MS. CORBETT: Yes. 25 COMMISSIONER REYES: Thank you.
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1 Or, would it be the 23rd? 2 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: You will get a draft -- 3 I think what Ms. Cheron is saying -- at the board 4 meeting in June, and then have a subsequent 5 meeting -- maybe July -- the final approval of the 6 audit. I think that's what she's saying. 7 COMMISSIONER REYES: You have to submit that. 8 MS. CORBETT: Yes. So we still have to make 9 sure it's submitted, right? 10 COMMISSIONER REYES: Right. By June 30th. 11 MS. CORBETT: By June 30th is the requirement 12 so that we're compliant; however, again, I think 13 planning for the future, when we think of this 14 overall process as it relates to audits, 15 the goal would be going forward to have the audit 16 clearly at least two months in advance of it 17 having to be submitted. 18 But I think that this is just a good step 19 right now thus far. Like we're reactive to things 20 historically, but going forward we will have a 21 plan in place in regards to like the overall 22 drafts. So you will be fully informed, 23 and we're going to open it for anyone, for the 24 Finance Committee. Any and every board member 25 can come out, you know, Commissioner, and we can	1 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Horovitz. 2 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I'm sorry. 3 Not to discount what you're talking about. 4 I'm looking at the email that Ms. Phillips just 5 sent scheduling, and, since all of this timing 6 around the audit makes a lot of sense, 7 maybe we should scuffle our June meetings around. 8 So right now the board meeting is scheduled 9 for Monday, June 23rd, but there is a 30th in the 10 month. And we've got finance early on June 13th, 11 and we've got governance on June 20th. 12 It might make sense to switch those two so 13 finance comes later, right? 14 MS. CORBETT: Yes, yes. 15 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Okay. We could even 16 move finance to the 23rd and then move our board 17 meeting to the 30th. 18 Does everyone have the email in front of 19 them? 20 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: Yes. 21 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: You sent it out? 22 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: It was previously 23 circulated. We sent it, yes. 24 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Let's have a 25 discussion around shuffling everything.

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1 COMMISSIONER REYES: Yes. I think that would 2 make sense. 3 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Okay. 4 COMMISSIONER REYES: 100 percent. 5 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yes. I'm not in 6 charge. 7 (People laughed.) 8 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: So I'm sorry. If we can 9 put this in proper posture as it relates to this 10 conversation, because we are in Old Business. 11 So we can close out Old Business, because it's 12 not. 13 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Well, the 14 Old Business is the audit. 15 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Correct. 16 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: We're having a 17 discussion around getting a draft to the board. 18 So we're still kind of in that discussion, 19 right? 20 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Okay. 21 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: We're talking about 22 how we can get together, again, and talk about it. 23 MS. CORBETT: Oh, I'll just pull it up. 24 That's fine. 25 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: So, Madam Chair, it is your	1 take out governance to be able to deal with the 2 audit, we can. 3 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Brock. 4 COMMISSIONER BROCK: I just want y'all to 5 keep in mind that, on the 27th of June, 6 we have the Resident Relations Committee Meeting, 7 and we have Resident Relations Resident Meeting on 8 the 27th. 9 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you for 10 bringing it to my attention. I don't see that in 11 the chart. 12 COMMISSIONER REYES: It's not on the chart. 13 COMMISSIONER BROCK: I gave it to 14 Ms. Phillips. 15 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: That's not what was 16 presented to me just a few minutes ago. 17 So I don't see it on this. 18 MS. CORBETT: We have Resident Relations 19 Committee on May 23rd. 20 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Moving the finance 21 and the governance to the 27th gives them even 22 more time. We don't currently have anything on 23 this calendar, and then that would be a few days 24 before the board meeting. 25 MS. CORBETT: The 27th.
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1 recommendation that we move finance to June 23rd, 2 Monday, June 23rd, and then our regular scheduled 3 board meeting to June the 30th. 4 Is that your recommendation? 5 MS. CORBETT: I think you were swapping the 6 Finance Committee with governance. 7 COMMISSIONER REYES: Why don't we join 8 finance with governance instead of having HR with 9 finance? 10 Move finance to June 20th. 11 MS. CORBETT: And governance swaps and does 12 June 13th. So it's a swap. 13 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Mr. Chair -- 14 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Sorry. 15 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: Just to further 16 confuse things, I know we, at one point said -- 17 COMMISSIONER BROCK: -- we have -- 18 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: -- we'd have 19 governance monthly, and then we came back and said 20 we were doing bimonthly. 21 So it's just like a holding space on a 22 monthly so that, if we needed it, we had it. 23 But we don't have to do governance monthly, 24 because we're still compiling the totality of what 25 we're discussing. So, if we need to completely	1 COMMISSIONER BROCK: We always -- 2 the Resident Relations -- Ms. Phillips, 3 when she was operating as the CEO -- me and her 4 had a conversation. Because we were reviewing the 5 bylaws of the board, and it was saying that we had 6 to at least have seven meetings a year. 7 And so what happened is we had to go 8 back-to-back for June, because July -- 9 I couldn't select July. Because July is our off 10 month. We don't do any meetings in July, 11 and so that's why it's set up for June the 27th 12 that me and Ms. Phillips talked about. 13 Am I correct? 14 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: But we all -- 15 we all do meet during July. 16 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: I would have to go back 17 and look at my notes. 18 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Okay, okay. 19 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: I know that there was 20 a -- 21 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: I have directions for that 22 25th. 23 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yeah. We have 24 meetings in July. 25 COMMISSIONER BROCK: No. We have no meetings

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1 in July. July has always been our off month. 2 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: The board can cancel the 3 meetings that are on the schedule, through the 4 Chair, I'm sorry. 5 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I think we should 6 keep them for now. 7 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: Yes. They are on the 8 schedule based on the regular meetings. 9 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Correct. 10 MS. MIXON-PHILLIPS: They, typically -- 11 historically, the board has opted not to have 12 them. 13 COMMISSIONER REYES: And, through the Chair, 14 I remember last year the only meeting that we had 15 in the month of July was the HR Committee, 16 because we were in the thick and thin of finding 17 the CEO. But we did not have a general board 18 meeting in July. 19 So that is true. We'd have to make a 20 decision whether or not we want to keep it for 21 this July. 22 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I think I have 23 respect for Commissioner Weatherby, who chairs 24 finance. I think, if we could reach out to her, 25 and ask her. I would say the latest day,	1 is we going to do June 27th for Resident 2 Relations? 3 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Reyes. 4 COMMISSIONER REYES: So I do think that we 5 need to give them as much time as possible, 6 but I would recommend, instead of the 27th, 7 Commissioner Horovitz -- I would recommend that 8 Friday before, June 20th, so that way we can have 9 a conversation here in the Finance Committee. 10 And that gives them a week to maybe do -- 11 you know, if we give them any feedback or make 12 any recommendations, that gives them a week to 13 kind of tighten that up. 14 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Sure. 15 COMMISSIONER REYES: Because, if we have it 16 on the 27th and they have to submit by that 17 Monday, you know, they might not have a whole lot 18 of time to do anything that we might recommend. 19 I don't know if that makes sense to you. 20 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: I agree. 21 MS. CORBETT: And one of the things I was 22 going to point out -- so one of the things 23 I wanted to mention, in regards to the audit -- 24 really, once the auditors have in place what needs 25 to be submitted, no changes could really be
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1 which would be the 27th, gives the team the most 2 time and then gives us the most productive 3 conversation as a board. 4 I'm hearing that it doesn't matter what we 5 say really. We have to submit on time. 6 MS. CORBETT: It matters. 7 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yes, of course. 8 Yes. 9 And then everyone is pretty much flexible 10 otherwise on Mondays and Fridays for shuffling? 11 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Let me move to Commissioner 12 Brock and then Commissioner Reyes. 13 COMMISSIONER BROCK: I'm just trying to get 14 some clarity. 15 So, is the board saying that June the 27th, 16 we don't want to do the Resident Relations on 17 June the 27th? 18 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I'm not saying -- 19 sorry. 20 Through the Chair, I heard us say, 21 "Are we all willing to shuffle all the meetings 22 around in order to get finance as late as 23 possible?" 24 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Yeah. I know. 25 But I'm just trying to figure out,	1 added. 2 And the only thing we'll have is just like 3 comments in regards to the plan going forward to 4 tackle those, but we won't be able to take, 5 you know, the board's input in regards to, 6 "Hey, Auditors, change X, Y, Z." 7 So it's really an FYI to kind of walk the 8 board through the entire audit more so, 9 but, you know, the 20th -- I mean it works for 10 us. 11 At the end of the day, we're going to be 12 working around the clock with the auditors to 13 bring this in as early as possible, but next year 14 we can most definitely plan just to have this 15 ready months in advance. 16 You know? 17 So, yes. But we're open to the time if you 18 want to swap it. 19 COMMISSIONER REYES: Well, then, if there is 20 not going to be any action from the board from our 21 recommendations then, yes. The 27th would make 22 sense to give you guys the most amount of time. 23 And then we could potentially shift finance 24 with Resident Relations and do that on the 20th. 25 I don't know if that makes sense.

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1 MS. CORBETT: June 20th? 2 COMMISSIONER REYES: June 20th. 3 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Okay. Because we had 4 already set up for June the 27th. 5 MS. CORBETT: You advertised the meeting? 6 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Yeah (sic). We were 7 going to be at The Waves. So that's why I was 8 trying to figure out what we are doing. 9 If we're not going to do it, then we need to 10 cancel it. I was just -- we were just trying to 11 complete what the bylaws said. That's why they 12 were back-to-back, because, normally, 13 they every other month. Yes. 14 MS. CORBETT: She has advertised for it. 15 COMMISSIONER REYES: Right. We're just 16 switching it one week. So you don't have to 17 cancel. You can just reschedule it for one week 18 before. 19 MS. CORBETT: Are you saying you advertised? 20 Did you advertise for it already is what 21 you're saying? 22 COMMISSIONER BROCK: No. We haven't 23 advertised for it, no, no, no, no, no, no. 24 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Can we do the 20th? 25 COMMISSIONER BROCK: So we're going to do	1 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Shirley, 2 you are the Chair of Governance. 3 Are you okay with that? 4 COMMISSIONER SHIRLEY: I accept that. 5 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: It has been accepted. 6 Madam Chair, do we need to take -- 7 COMMISSIONER REYES: Commissioner Weatherby 8 -- 9 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: -- yes. Commissioner 10 Weatherby is not here. 11 But, Commissioner Horovitz, do we need to 12 take an official vote on this? 13 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I don't think so. 14 MR. REECE: It's not official business. 15 Yes. 16 COMMISSIONER ROGERS: So all right. 17 We have that taken care of. 18 Any further discussion on that? 19 (no response) 20 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Seeing or hearing none, 21 thank you so much. Thank you so much for that. 22 Onward to New Business. We will move into 23 our New Business. I'm not sure who is presenting 24 Resolution 2025-JHA-17. This is the signature 25 authorization.
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1 Resident Relations on the 20th? 2 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: On the 20th. 3 COMMISSIONER REYES: Correct. 4 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Okay. All right. 5 And, usually, the committee meeting is usually at 6 10:00, 10:00 to 11:00. So finance would have to 7 be at 9:00. 8 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: No, no. Finance is the 9 27th. 10 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Oh, okay, okay, okay. 11 COMMISSIONER REYES: We can move HR then so 12 that we can put it -- 13 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Okay. No worries. 14 Okay, okay. No worries. 15 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Reyes. 16 COMMISSIONER REYES: -- my recommendation is 17 this. We move the HR Committee meeting to Friday, 18 June 20th, at 9:00 a.m. followed by the 19 Resident Relations Committee Meeting at 10:00 a.m. 20 on June 20th. 21 Move the Finance Committee to June 27th at 22 9:00 a.m. and not have a Governance Committee 23 Meeting for that month to make room for this 24 audit. 25 That's my recommendation.	1 Who is presenting? 2 MS. CORBETT: Very brief. I mean I can most 3 definitely. 4 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Real quick. I'm sorry. 5 Let me get us in proper posture. 6 Can I have a motion to entertain 7 Resolution 2025-JHA-17 at this time? 8 COMMISSIONER BROCK: I make a motion. 9 COMMISSIONER REYES: Second. 10 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: It has been properly 11 moved and seconded. 12 Is there any discussion? 13 (no response) 14 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Seeing or hearing none, 15 are you presenting it, Ms. Corbett? 16 MS. CORBETT: Yes. This is just a brief 17 resolution in order to convey signatory 18 authorization basically from Roslyn Phillips to 19 myself going forward as it relates to the banking, 20 our financial institutions, banking accounts, 21 also, transactions, too, as well, in the dealings 22 as it relates to our trust. 23 What we're finding is that we need to be able 24 to provide a resolution to our financial 25 institutions to let them know to basically replace

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1 her signature with my signature going forward. 2 So that's what this resolution is. 3 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Is there any discussion? 4 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Through the Chair -- 5 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Commissioner Horovitz. 6 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: -- so I understand -- 7 so the resolution -- this is a timing issue. 8 This should have happened before? 9 Because we already made the changes, right? 10 MS. CORBETT: I think that you are still 11 listed. 12 MS. DAVIS: Yes. We made the changes with 13 TD Bank -- 14 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Yes -- 15 MS. DAVIS: -- but there are other -- 16 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: -- yes. Got it. 17 Okay. 18 MS. DAVIS: -- financial institutions. 19 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: All right. 20 Thank you. 21 MS. CORBETT: So this should have been an 22 entire -- just a signatory authorization. 23 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Okay. 24 MS. CORBETT: This would really suffice 25 versus an individual one off TD Bank's.	1 But, do you think we need to make the edit? 2 Because I know you-all had a chance to review 3 it from a legal standpoint. 4 MR. WILSON: I mean I think as it is it's 5 broad enough to encompass any CFO. If you're 6 okay with any CFO having access to the financial 7 records, then I think it could be approved. 8 MS. You may continue. 12 MR. WEATHERS: No problem. 13 As I was saying, in late April, 14 we held Public Solicitation CN-011-25 to 15 procure the services of a roofing contractor 16 to replace the roofs at our Westwood Apartment 17 properties. 18 We received six sealed bids as part of the 19 invitation for bid process. They were all 20 received and reviewed for responsiveness and 21 responsibility, and we are presenting this 22 resolution today to authorize the contract to 23 Lewis Walker Roofing, who was deemed the winner of 24 that bidding process for a sum total \$619,432. 25 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: You have heard the summary	1 Commissioner Reyes, I apologize. 2 COMMISSIONER REYES: Commissioner Rogers, 3 I hate to do this to you, but, since you love 4 posture so much, for the record. 5 So, for the past two resolutions, 6 we've had an initial vote, and then you have a 7 first and a second, and then, at the end, 8 you're also requesting a first and a second for 9 both of them. 10 So there's going to be four names per 11 resolution just for Ms. Carol. WEATHERS: Yes, sir, I am. 8 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: All right. The floor is 9 yours. 10 MR. WEATHERS: So -- 11 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Sorry. Before you 12 go, I have to step out for an 11:30. 13 COMMISSIONER REYES: Me, too. I have a hard 14 stop. 15 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: I assure you we're going to 16 get through this before then. 17 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Not if we have four 18 seconds. 19 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: So I'll cut it down. 20 All right. I'm sorry. 21 MR. WEATHERS: Okay. I'll try to be as 22 efficient as possible. 23 This has been an issue that has been a 24 discussion in several board meetings before. 25 So this represents kind of the next phase of where	1 and that is, when does this take effect? 2 When does the six months start? 3 MR. WEATHERS: This would take effect 4 effective May, and then it would have maximum 5 end prior to the next fiscal year in October. 6 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Thank you so much. 7 If there are no questions, all in favor of 8 said resolution, signify by saying, "Aye." 9 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Aye. 10 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Aye. 11 MR. 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1 we're at regarding security guard services 2 JHA-wide for our properties. 3 So we are proposing to move our current 4 vendor, who is Bangor Security, and pay them on a 5 month-to-month basis rather than the traditional 6 yearly renewal and most recently the six-month 7 packet that we have been doing. 8 We're now going month-to-month. A little 9 background. The reason we're doing so is we 10 currently have a solicitation, as we speak, 11 out for the security services JHA-wide that was 12 put out this week via public notice. 13 We expect bids to be due for that particular 14 solicitation mid-June. So this resolution is 15 asking that we simply pay Bangor Security on a 16 monthly basis month-to-month with the monthly 17 renewal amount in the amount of \$62,387.43 18 monthly, not to exceed a total value of 19 six months' worth of payments for the remainder of 20 the contract. 21 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: You have heard said 22 resolution on JHA-19. 23 Are there any discussions? 24 (no response) 25 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: I only have one question,	1 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: See, I got like 100 motions 2 going on. 3 (People laughed.) 4 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: All in favor of approving 5 said resolution, signify by saying, "Aye." 6 COMMISSIONER BROCK: Aye. 7 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Aye. 8 COMMISSIONER REYES: Aye. 9 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Any opposed likewise? 10 (no response) 11 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: By your action, you have 12 approved said Resolution JHA-19. 13 All right. I'm trying to keep up. 14 At this time, I will move into -- we have, 15 Closing Comments, and then we have the 16 CEO's Comments. 17 I'm going to withhold my comments, 18 because I have a lot of questions as it relates to 19 the five houses. 20 But, because we don't have time to discuss 21 that -- because my question -- we approved -- 22 and I'll do it here, but I'll withhold all of my 23 statements. 24 But we approved the resolution regarding one 25 company. Said company is no longer doing it.

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1 I guess we're going to have another resolution for 2 the new company to come back to this board. 3 I thought we did, but I guess not. 4 If you-all recall, it was this board -- 5 and I've have got some issues with that -- 6 it was this board who originally denied the first 7 company, and we were told we had to go with that 8 company for legal reasons. 9 And then -- so I got a lot of questions as it 10 relates to if those five properties will be 11 completed on time as we -- but I know we have a 12 hard 11:30. So I'll yield all of that to our ... 13 but that is some stuff that I want to bring up at 14 our next meeting. Because I was -- 15 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I'm unclear. 16 Through the Chair, the company that was 17 out-of-state is no longer building the five houses? 18 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: That is correct. 19 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: I missed that. 20 MS. CORBETT: That's an update I'm about to 21 give. 22 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Okay. 23 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: So I'll yield. 24 MS. CORBETT: That was actually my update. 25 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: Okay. So I will yield.	1 I think it's very important to know 2 that they can indeed perform. The deadline date 3 is for September of 2025. They wanted to 4 jump-start the permitting process. They are here 5 local versus the other developer was out-of-state 6 in Georgia -- has not physically truly had boots 7 on the ground, based on our in-depth discussion 8 with that particular developer. 9 But First Coast has an extensive background 10 and was basically the second one, and they had 11 confirmed that they could indeed have these homes 12 built on time at an amount of \$965,600.57. 13 So that's still less than the \$1,000,000. 14 Each of these five single-family homes will 15 be up to approximately 1,270 square feet. 16 So we do have them, because I think it's 17 important, before we get to the board meeting, 18 just to kind of talk about their capability, 19 their experience, too, as well, their commitment. 20 And we're still requiring an in-depth 21 completed project schedule that shows your team 22 and your ability to fulfill this mission for our 23 agency. So all right. 24 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: Thank you for that. 25 CHAIRMAN ROGERS: My only question,
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1 MS. CORBETT: So, in regards to the 2 Daisy Plan Home Development, which is five 3 single-family homes located in the Durkeeville 4 area community, there was \$1,000,000 that was 5 allocated to Jacksonville Housing Authority. 6 What's happened is that Corporate Vision are 7 no longer going to be able to supply us with -- 8 well, to be able to construct those five 9 single-family homes. 10 We had a recent in-depth discussion with 11 this particular developer/general contractor, 12 and a letter was actually issued to them as a 13 result of default for their inability to be able 14 to perform. 15 They were not able to obtain all of the 16 permits that's required. In addition to that, 17 their team was not placed -- fully put together as 18 of date. So that letter, that notification went 19 out certified to them and also electronically via 20 email. 21 However, the great thing about this is just 22 having solutions in place. The second 23 developer/general contractor that was in place, 24 which is actually here today online, 25 is First Coast Construction.	1 Madam Chair -- and maybe Commissioner Horovitz can 2 answer this or to the attorney -- do we need a 3 resolution for this new company, or will there be 4 an emergency resolution for this company? 5 How does that work when we have already 6 approved one, and they cannot fulfill? 7 "Is board action required," I guess is my 8 question. 9 COMMISSIONER HOROVITZ: There's a process in 10 place for that, right? 11 If the Number One based on the -- go ahead. 12 MR. WEATHERS: Correct. So the background 13 information is exactly as Ms. Corbett said 14 regarding this particular vendor. 15 So, just as a point of reference so everyone 16 knows, the Notice of Termination was formally sent 17 to the previous vendor, Corporate Vision, 18 with a certified notification in the mail as well 19 as an email. So that part of it has been 20 completed. 21 The new vendor has been notified according to 22 the bid tabulation sheets that we had from the 23 original solicitation. They were rereviewed, 24 and they were identified, First Coast 25 Construction, as the vendor who adequately

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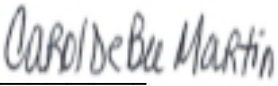
